

We are going to the William Morris Gallery, where we will explore his life and what he made.



When I first arrive at the Gallery, I will see it is in a park! I can explore the park more or go into the Gallery's front door. It is an old building where William Morris lived.



I will enter through the front door. I do not need to buy a ticket or line up. There will be someone there to greet me and say hello. They will be wearing a green or blue and purple lanyard ID or a volunteer badge.






If I want, the Welcome Desk can help me borrow a sensory satchel, filled with toys and activities to help guide me through my visit.



While I am in the Gallery, I will be sure to follow these rules to keep the objects safe:

- I will not touch the art, furniture on display, or walls to keep the objects safe and clean.
- I will only touch something if there is a sign saying I can.
- I will eat and drink in the cafe on the main floor, not in the galleries.
- I will stay with my group.

I can look at my sensory map to choose what rooms I want to explore. I can visit them all or just a few. Some areas may be busy with people or be noisy. This is okay, they are also here to enjoy the Gallery. If I need a break, I can find the quiet spots on the map, or ask the Welcome Desk for help.




Some of the lights will be low. I can use the torch in my satchel if I want. Some of the objects on display are furniture, but I cannot sit or touch them. If they are on display, they will be behind rope or on a platform. The other chairs in the Gallery I can sit on.








The toilets are on the ground floor by the cafe. I can use them anytime during my visit. If I do not like the sound of the hand dryers, I can use the paper towels, or the hand sanitizer by the front entrance.



To go upstairs, I can take the main stairs or the lift. The lift is near the toilets. The lift is slow and makes sounds, but that is okay. If I need help to use it, I can ask the Welcome Desk.





The Gallery has a cafe. I can eat and drink here if I like. There will be many different smells of food and I can look up the menu online before I visit. The cafe might be busy, lots of people like to eat here. I can sit inside or take my food outside to eat.





The ground floor has rooms about William Morris and his friends and all the different things they made.






Upstairs has rooms about his books and his work to help others. In this second room, there are red lights and a film playing. If I do not like this, I can leave the room.

There are rooms on each level for temporary exhibitions that happen twice a year. I can look online to see what is currently on display and ask the Welcome Desk about any sounds, lights, or experiences I should know about.
